Are you looking for an opportunity to apply your skills and expertise to a program that aims to increase St'át'imc capacity and readiness for success. If yes, then working for St'át'imc is the opportunity you're seeking.

We administer programs to support St'át'imc priorities of effective resource management, upholding our culture, and developing economic opportunities for our people. The St'át'imc Education and Training (SET) program promotes quality education and training to ensure St'át'imc members, individually and collectively, are prepared for opportunities to meaningfully participate in their communities and the economy. We want to support the capacity develop and increase opportunity readiness for the ucwalmicw (the people of the land).

The St'át'imc Education & Training (SET) Program Manager is responsible for providing leadership and coordination of the SET Program for communities, including planning, program development and implementation, financial management, supporting community capacity development, strategic partnership development, and reporting in consultation/collaboration with the SGS Administrator.

The immediate priority of the SET Program is to negotiate an agreement between St'át'imc and BC Hydro that provides for the development and maintenance of a long-term Education & Training Program for the St'át'imc. The Program will be a joint program of BC Hydro and the St'at'imc (PC) with accountability for the development and implementation being shared equally between both parties. The successful candidate will take a leadership role over the implementation of this priority.

The successful candidate will have:

- A degree in a field related to education, capacity building and partnership development, and a minimum of six years' working experience. Applicable experience working with indigenous communities is a desired asset.
- Experience researching, developing, and negotiating community enhancement agreement for the benefit of indigenous people.
- Proven ability to establish and utilize networks to link indigenous learners to opportunities that support capacity development and achievement of academic success to increase the overall success of St'at'imc individually and collectively.
- Project management experience including design/planning, implementation (including financial management and budgeting), reporting, change management, and sustainment.





- Ability to communicate effectively both verbally and written in both one-to-one and large group environments.
- Self-motivated individual who can work independently or as part of a team as required
